The fast food franchise McDonald's offers spaces for children that are far from the eco-inclusive concept. An eco-inclusive space is understood as all those areas in which social justice, equality, democratization and sustainability are paramount. In contrast, the chosen children's environment lacks, for example, accessibility and adaptability tools, since people with little or no mobility would not be able to benefit from its use. Thus, there are no structures, access routes or information

panels in different formats, suitable for all types of needs.

On the other hand, the lack of a sustainable space where the control of waste consumption, the use of recyclable materials or the use of renewable energies is carried out is considered an important point to be addressed. Aspects of this kind are essential for the development of a correct environmental awareness among citizens, as the promotion of ecological practices should not only be a theoretical concept, but also a day-to-day practice. However, there are no recycling points installed in the playground, which contributes a little to the above.

Finally, there are also problems with the location of the park. The selected area concentrates most of the concessionaires, shopping malls and department stores in the area are concentrated, so there is an abundance of public and private transport, resulting in a space that not only threatens the road safety of the park's public, but also noise and environmental pollution, freedom and autonomy of play and one's own health.
